### **A. ABOUT THE CENTER**

Nakyasasa Incubation Center is a Business Research, Incubation and Skilling Center (BRISC) which is jointly implemented by Makerere University (MAK) and the Government of Uganda through a multi-disciplinary and multi-sectoral partnership fashion. We are located at Namulonge along Zirowe Road, 20 KM from Kampala. Our main focus is developing and nurturing novel and bankable commercial enterprises along a variety of animal value chains and ultimately transform households across the country. Nakyasasa BRISC was established as part of the joint effort of the University and government to promote SPEDA model, an alternative model of skilling education, community and household transformation. SPEDA model is championed by MAK College of Veterinary Medicine, Animal Resources and Biosecurity (COVAB) through its community development institute – AFRISA (Africa Institute for Strategic Animal Resource Services and Development). We train and nurture students, youth, farmers, households and companies to develop and transform their emerging enterprises into viable and bankable business ventures. We work through mutually beneficial partnership arrangements and our core activities at the center run throughout the year.

### **B. ABOUT THE MARCH-JUNE 2020 SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES**

We have received scholarship offers for short term trainings in a number of enterprises in favor of vulnerable youth. These scholarships have been provided by the Government of Uganda Ministry of Education and Sports (Department of Business, Technical and Vocational Education (BTVET) through our Consortium Partner for Non-Formal Education - Greatlakes Industrial Institute (GLIDE). The scholarships are prioritized for delivery using the SPEDA model. Scholarships are limited. They are given out on first come, first serve basis provided you meet the criteria. Applications are open to all vulnerable youth (18-35 years).
